

## Advisory notes for ASK Trust library catalogue

The **lending period** is usually for **one month** unless one of the following code letters is just after the title:

"**R**" means it is a reference book available to all borrowers. The loan period is **two weeks**.

"**RM**" means it is a reference book available to members of ASK only. The loan period is two weeks.

"**M**" means it is for ASK members only, but the loan period in this case is for four weeks.

**Allowance for time in the post:** the ASK librarian will add a few days on to the loan period to allow for NZ Post delivery and return times ie your loan period when the books are actually with you, can be expected to be the full period outlined above.

**To borrow** – maximum two items simultaneously – please return to the ASK Trust library page on the website and follow the easy borrowing process.
